SCHOOL REPORT	Grade 4 Team Presentation
	 Grade 4 Team Presentation The grade four team shared their initiatives, including themed days like Movie Monday and Thinking Thursday to encourage creativity and curiosity. They created a slideshow with thought-provoking questions for students to discuss during lunch. The team is excited about an upcoming project where each class will represent a region of Alberta, allowing students to experience different traditions and celebrations. This will take place in June A field trip to the Nose Creek Museum is scheduled for May 5th to May 9th, focusing on Indigenous learning and local history. The grade four team also discussed home reading incentives, including a winter read-a-

thon and plans for a spring read-a-thon to
boost engagement in reading at home.
Principal's Report (Rachelle Prud'Homme)
 The principal provided updates on school goals, including the importance of creativity and curiosity, and ongoing lessons about bullying through the Dare to Care program. The school is expecting an increase in student enrollment next year, with projections of over 800 students. Plans for accommodating this growth, including potential portables, are still in discussion. The principal highlighted the importance of purchasing yearbooks and shared updates on the school's website, including access to school goals and reports.
 Trustee Todd provided updates from recent board meetings, including the approval of new capital plans and planning funding for a new K- 8 school in Airdrie. He discussed the challenges of construction timelines due to potential tariffs affecting material availability. Todd also mentioned the ongoing efforts to improve Indigenous learning within Rocky View Schools and the budget process for the upcoming year.
The treasurer's report indicated a balance of approximately \$5,027.46, with additional funds expected from Healthy Hunger initiatives.
