We support students' learning and success by understanding their strengths and letting them learn at their own pace and in their own ways, with empathy and care. Student learning is supported with universal design approaches, targeted strategies, and intensive support plans. During conflicts or incidents, we use collaborative problemsolving methods, restorative practices, and progressive discipline, designed to help students learn, grow, and improve in their actions and choices.

Public education is a shared responsibility. With students, families, employees, and our community, we work together to build positive learning environments for student success.

Students have the responsibility to attend school regularly and punctually, be ready to learn, and actively engage in, and diligently pursue, their education. We work to ensure each student and staff member is provided with a welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe learning environment that respect diversity and fosters a sense of belonging.

SUCCESS FOR ALL EDWARDS SERVICES & SUPPORTS

At École Edwards we believe in the unique potential of all students. We celebrate the diversity of our learners and focus on their strengths. Edwards School creates rich learning environments and provides support to help students be the best they can be!

At Edwards, students are supported in their learning in a variety of ways:

- **Classroom Teachers** have varied universal approaches, small group, and one-to-one focused support in goal setting, literacy, numeracy, Individual Program Planning (IPP), social/emotional support, and ensuring students feel safe and secure.
- Learning Support Teachers and Teamssupport students with targeted or intensive learning needs, and they support teachers with collaborative solutions and options in classrooms.
- Child Development Advisors support students with social and emotional needs beyond academics and the classroom. These concerns could be a result of anxiety, conflicts with friends, difficulties at home, or when a family or student is in crisis. A request for the CDA can be made by a parent, teacher, or administration.
- Educational Assistants support our most vulnerable, medically fragile, or complex students with safety plans, behavior plans, medical plans, and more! They are highly skilled and amazing!

*Please note - funding and services are not directly tied to student diagnosis.

Accessing Learning Supports for Your Child: 1. The first step for parents and guardians who

- have questions or concerns about their child's success in school is <u>to speak with their child's</u> classroom teacher to discuss those concerns.
 - a. <u>Ed Psych Reports, medical letters, or</u> <u>diagnoses must be submitted to Learning</u> <u>Support Teachers</u> for review, and record keeping. They will enable an IPP or other learning support plan, as required.
 - b.<u>Teachers are the lead for IPPs</u> in consultation with LSTs, CDA, and Admin.
 - c.<u>IPPs are created due to a diagnosis and</u> <u>subsequent code,</u> and dependant on the impact on student learning.
- 2. Next, the classroom teacher will consult with the school <u>learning support team</u> for collaborative problem-solving and additional strategies for support, or services required.
- 3. If there is a need identified for a specialized assessment or on-going support, the school team will work with the parent/guardian on a formal referral for additional planning/ support.

An Edwards Learning Support Team is designated for each classroom to support teachers, students, and families. This support may include consultation, specialized assessments, targeted or intensive support, and strategies.

SCHOOL COMMUNICATIONS HOME

At École Edwards we value parents and guardians as important partners for student success. Teachers communicate by email weekly about learning to families. The school's newsletter, The Family Express is emailed home monthly. Another great way to stay involved is by participating in-person or online in our monthly School Council meetings.

We are a Real-Time Reporting school, which means there is no formal report card throughout the year. Teachers update feedback and evaluations biweekly or monthly in all subjects with a final summary report card at the end of the year. You can find all teacher feedback, student progress, and assessments on learning in Power School.

ATTENDANCE, VISITORS & WEATHER

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

At École Edwards we celebrate excellent attendance and create support plans for attendance concerns.

Punctuality and regular attendance are important for successful learning and establishing good life habits.

The school office must be notified each day that your child will be absent or when arriving late, and a reason should be provided. **SafeArrival** is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence. You are asked to report your child's absence in advance whenever possible using the SchoolMessenger app.

Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store go.schoolmessenger.ca.

Absences can be reported in advance 24 hours/day, 7 days a week.

We send home letters to cele<mark>brate</mark> attendance and notify families about absences, 3 times a year - Nov, F<mark>eb, May</mark>.

VISITORS & VOLUNTEERS

Parents, guardians, and visitors are most welcome at our school. All visitors MUST report to the main office to sign-in upon their arrival. All doors are locked during the school day. Visitor access in the building is through the front entrance by a camera intercom system. All guests will be issued a visitor badge that must always be worn in the building and are expected to follow safety guidelines which are described on the badges.

All volunteers (at the school or on a field trip) are required to have a valid Criminal Record Check and a signed confidentiality agreement for the school. Siblings are not permitted on field trips. Ask the office for the necessary paperwork.

To minimize classroom disruptions and ensure a safe and secure environment, families are asked to pick up and drop off their student at the office or outside their assigned door at regular dismissal times.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Students are to come dressed for school ready for Alberta weather. During the winter that means toques, mitts, boots, snow pants, and a jacket. If it is -20°C with the wind chill or colder the school will have indoor recesses. During the warmer weather, students should have hats and sunblock. We will also have indoor recesses if there are other safety reasons, such as icy conditions, muddy conditions, strong winds, or lightning storms. School closures are decided by the school division by 6 AM; however, we encourage parents to use their own judgment regarding the safety of their child.
